PROTOCOLS FOR COUNTY-WIDE DTC CLASSES

- 1) If you have a temperature or other illness symptoms <u>do</u> not come to class. If you are in contact with someone that has been diagnosed with COVID-19 do not come to class. If you are an instructor and cannot teach, contact the training director (Linda Hause) immediately so that the class can be covered or cancelled as needed for that day.
- 2) We recognize that we live in a county with lots of pollen. Allergies do not prevent you from attending class.
- 3) Hand sanitizer will be available in the building with sanitizing wipes and disinfectant spray.
- 4) Our club will follow the masking mandates required by the Sonoma County Public Health requirements which change depending on current COVID infection rates. If the current mandate requires a mask then no mask; no class. As a business we are required to follow this protocol. If a student in class prefers not to wear a mask they will be asked to leave and we will refund for the remainder of the session. Coming to class is acknowledgement and acceptance of this requirement.
- 5) Students are encouraged to bring their own chairs and crates. Club chairs and crates may be used in class at the student's descretion.
- 6) Students will enter from the porch area through the office. While waiting to enter a 6 ft distance must be maintained between students. Students will exit through the large roll up door which will remain up during classes do facilitate air flow.

- 7) There will be a 15 minute break between classes to allow one group to exit and the next to enter. Please encourage your students to exit promptly to allow the next class to come in. One class must exit completely before the next group enters.
- 8) Instructors will, as much as possible, ensure that six feet of social distancing is maintained during class. For example, practicing figure 8's will need to be done with cones; group heeling will need to maintain 6 feet between students when setting up. Students will need to be cognizant of their spacing; instructors will need to remind students as necessary to maintain distance.

By working together we can continue to work with our dogs and enjoy the social interactions we have while training with our friends. These protocols will be revised as County and State requirements permit.
